Registration Number, organizations must be able to produce a charitable tax receipt for full donation amount

Exclusionary Conditions: TD will not fund schools; religious organizations; sports teams and sporting events; individual initiatives/pursuits; recreational groups; conference;

golf tournaments; audio visual production

Exclusionary Conditions:	Alterna will not fund po outside Alterna's marke		activities; individuals; deficit funding; retroactive funding; programs or projects

Funding Criteria: Organizations must be 'qualified donees' therefore organizations must be federally registered charities and municipalities. All funding initiatives

have individual qualifying criteria.

Exclusionary Conditions: Requests that will not be considered are those which match government funding; which reduce accumulated capital or operating deficits; for

annual operating funds; for purely academic or basic research; in which the primary activity involves training, scholarships, or subsidies; in which

the primary activity takes place outside of Canada

Funding Criteria: Organizations must be registered as a charity with the Canadian Revenue Agency; organizations must be based and operational in the City of

Toronto, for some funding opportunities organizations can be based in Southern Ontario

Exclusionary Conditions: The Metcalf Foundation generally does not consider application that are part of a general fundraising campaign; to reduce accumulated capital or

operational deficits; for research or activities related to healthcare or education; for international work; involving partisan political activities

Funding Criteria:	Organizations incorporated as non-profits or charities; operating for at least 3 years, revenues of over \$250,000 per year; cash flow that will allow them to repay the loan; can speak about the impact both of their organization and how the loan or financing support will contribute to this impact		
Exclusionary Conditions:		to non-profits and charities that are 'loan ready' wh s plans; repayment sources	nich requires financial strength; management and governance; planning

Funding Criteria:

Organizations, entrepreneurs, small-to-medium businesses and social enterprises located in Northern Ontario and rural Southern Ontario residing within the boundaries of the 61 Community Futures Development Corporations are eligible for CFDC support and services.

Exclusionary Conditions: Program is only available to companies in Northern Ontario, and Rural Southern Ontario



Co-operators Group

Grants and Donations

Community economic development initiatives; growth and sustainability of existing co-operatives

Funding Criteria:

To be eligible for a grant, organizations must be legally incorporated as a co-operative at the time of their application.

Exclusionary Conditions:

Co-operators will not fund capital expenditure; ongoing operational expenses; deficit reduction; retroactive expenses; fund-raising initiatives

Exclusionary Conditions:

Social enterprises

Funding Criteria:	Be an incorporated non-profit organization with charitable status or be sponsored by a charitable organization; be managed by a volunteer Board of Directors or Steering Committee; be located and operating in the City of Toronto; attend TEF's mandatory workshops (person responsible for social enterprise)		
Exclusionary Conditions:	No information could b	pe located on exclusions

Funding Criteria: Grants are made only to a registered charity as that term is defined in the Income Tax Act.

Exclusionary Conditions: There is a two-year time period between multi-year grant commitments to the same organization

Funding Criteria:	A charitable organization or foundation registered as a charity by the Canada Revenue Agency; an organization incorporated as a not-for-profit corporation; an unincorporated branch or chapter of a registered charity or incorporated not-for-profit organization; a First Nation; a Métis or other Aboriginal community; a collaborative of two or more organizations that are working together to achieve a common goal		
Exclusionary Conditions:	Individuals; organizations whose purpose is related to political activity; for-profit organizations; municipalities with populations over 20,000; universities/colleges, schools, hospitals and their agencies; agencies of provincial or federal governments; private foundations		



Centre for Social Innovation (CSI)

Crowd Funding Social innovation projects and initiatives that have a positive social or environmental impact.

Funding Criteria: CSI's Catalyst is open to anyone or any group that is involved in social innovation. If you submit a qualified project on Catalyst you must become a member of CSI's network for a minimum of 3 months. Critical factors to be successfully crowdfunded: the idea, the innovators ability to tap into

networks of potential supporters; creative and enticing rewards; campaign promotion

Exclusionary Conditions: Must be a CSI member for a minimum of 3 months



Centre for Social Innovation (CSI)	Micro Loan	Social enterprises that address a social, environmental, economic or cultural challenge	http://socialinnovation.ca/catapult
Funding Criteria:	Must be an Ontario-based social enterprise; must be incorporated as a for-profit, non-profit, or other business model as acceptable to the loan review committee; must be a member of the Centre for Social Innovation; must be working on the development of a revenue-generating social enterprise; must have fewer than 25 full-time employees; must have annual revenue under \$2 Million		
Exclusionary Conditions:	Must be a member	of CSI
